

By fostering the curiosity, imagination and creativity of our learners, we aim to give all children the inner resources to face the challenges of a rapidly changing world. We do this by adopting an experiential learning offer. Our lessons, school activities and extra-curricular opportunities all aim to give pupils as many learning experiences as possible. Experiences where they can be active and hands on in their learning and to develop into confident and resilient people.

#### Our classes



Llanbister school offers three mixed age range classes. These classes offer smaller class sizes and teachers that get to know each individual pupil. Teachers aim to adopt teaching styles to suit all learning needs and offer provision for every learner in their classroom. We have an established outdoor learning provision. This consists of an outside all weather canopy area, a playground, a forest school area and an outdoor field.

### Our curriculum



With the introduction of curriculum for Wales in September 2022, Llanbister school has been developing a curriculum that is flexible and engaging to suit the needs of individual learners. We put the learner's ideas, thoughts and opinions into the centre of our planning and learning. With the four purposes of the curriculum in mind, our learners inform their own learning journey through the school with the adult guiding them and introducing them to new experiences.





We conduct Llanbister experience days. These aim to target specific learning intentions or overarching topics. We want our learners to be immersed in their learning and to make it as purposeful as possible so the children can make connections between what we are learning and why we are learning it. We offer a wide and broad curriculum in Llanbister. Our pupils have the opportunity to engage in a wide range of opportunities. These include music, art, drama, sport, digital learning and STEM projects. We want children to enjoy learning, not just whilst they are in school but to instill a love of learning they will take with them into adulthood.

#### Drama and music


Our pupils have access to a wide variety of creative opportunities. We conduct assemblies and performances in our large hall. We have visits from a variety of shows and theatrical productions to inspire and enthuse our learners. Music lessons are held weekly and we have a large variety of brass, woodwind and string instruments available to our pupils.





Every year we hold our school Eisteddfod where our pupils are encouraged to showcase their talents. Pupils can sing, recite, bake cakes, create art work, play music and write poems in an effort to win the Eisteddfod chair. This helps the children to understand their Welsh culture in more depth but also allows them to gain confidence in performing and becoming creative and enterprising contributors to school life.









We are proud of the sporting opportunities our young people have in Llanbister. These activities range from Judo, Karate, Rugby to Badminton, Tennis and Cricket. All pupils attend swimming lessons from the age of reception and we enter county led sporting competitions where possible. Our annual sports day gives pupils the opportunity to compete against each other in their four coloured houses and to demonstrate the skills they have developed through the year.



## Extra-curricular activities



To supplement an engaging curriculum, we also offer a wide variety of after school opportunities for our learners. These range from sports such as netball, cricket, karate and badminton, coding and St John Badgers. The after-school clubs change termly and are very popular with learners in school.

### Digital learning

We are very fortunate to be able to offer an extensive digital provision to our pupils. All of our classes are equipped with interactive boards, iPads and chrome books. We have a confident group of digital champions in school who are available to offer support and guidance for all matters digital. The school has a weekly coding club to teach children about block-based programming.

# Outdoor learning

We are passionate about outdoor learning. We take every opportunity to take our learning into the outdoor space our school has to offer. We have a large field for our planting and growing opportunities in our raised beds, a large under cover area and a large playground. Classes have weekly outdoor sessions where the focus is on taking measured risk, planting, growing, harvesting, preparing areas and much more. This is alongside blended learning where language or numeracy can be taken outside the classroom.











## School Committees



We encourage our learners to become independent learners. One of the ways in which we do this is to allow our pupils to plan and deliver school committee take overs. All pupils in the upper age ranges of the school are asked to take an active role in either Eco school, Healthy school, Criw Cymraeg, School council or become a Digital lead. The children are then asked to plan and coordinate activities for the other learners in the school to teach something about their committee focus or to provide a learning experience. Activities have included litter picking, junk modelling, making Welsh cakes, Zumba, adopted a Gorilla and programmed a micro: bit, just to name few.
